Silage Chopping Time Approaching

Please let Buck Agency know if you are planning to chop silage so we can start the adjustment process by turning in a Notice of Loss. Advance notice may give us time to coordinate an adjuster to appraise the acres to be chopped while the field is still standing.



A silage chopping appraisal is considered a hard record and is needed to determine the production of the field.

MPCI and Crop-Hail Insurance Premiums

	MPCI	Crop-Hail
Billing Date:	September 1st, 2017	October 1st, 2017
Payment Due By:	September 30th, 2017	October 31st, 2017
Interest Accruing On:	October 1st, 2017	November 1st, 2017



Watch for your MPCI and Crop-Hail Premium billing statement in the mail. Payments must be postmarked by the due date to avoid accruing interest.

Hard & Soft Records & How Long to Keep Them

Good records, both hard & soft, are necessary to show the dispersal of your total production for the crop year and are required if you are randomly selected for a review. Anyone in a \$200,000 loss per crop/per county situation is required to provide records.

Insureds are required to have records for the <u>current</u> year & the <u>three</u> previous years available if selected for a review.

Livestock & Records



An adjuster's measurements of stored feed/grain will provide you with a hard record of bushels should a future review be required. Daily feed records provide additional documentation for production verification. If you use feed records to verify production, call us to request a measurement.

Cover Crops

Cover crops have the potential to benefit the soil. Should you decide to plant a cover crop, be aware that there are 4 zones used to determine when a cover crop should be terminated.

Moody, Lake, Brookings, Deuel, Minnehaha, and all western Minnesota counties fall under zone 3—which indicates to terminate the cover crop at or before planting. If you have further

questions on the termination policy or for information on a county not listed, please call the Buck Agency office.
